



## Plan of the Day

- Campers arrive at the Museum, where they are signed in and welcomed by Camp Intrepid staff.
- Our day begins with outdoor Pier Challenges (weather permitting), followed by interactive investigation in the Museum's Exploreum, where icebreakers help us learn about each other as we continue our exploration of the Museum with our groups.
- Getting to know our counselors and new friends is always better with healthy, nut-free snacks, which are provided by staff.
- After going over the day's schedule, lessons and projects related to the week's theme, we venture into the galleries, where campers make connections and draw inferences about their topics.
- Already a busy day, we're ready for lunch. We dine in the VIP room or alfresco on the starboard aircraft elevator (weather permitting).
- To assess the campers' understanding of the lessons, our afternoon may include one of the following:
  - Designing and creating projects such as solar ovens, crew and mission patches, 3D models, volcanoes, straw rockets, passports and human constellations.
  - Using engineering skills to build and test bridges, boats, ships, space habitats and vehicles.
  - Building telescopes, designing and creating navigational devices, making a model of our solar system.
  - Visiting our pop-up planetarium, where campers gain a better understanding of the role stars and planets play in our universe and create their own star stories, galaxies and planets.
- We often have former crew members, curators, plane restorers, and Museum staff members share their expertise and experiences and tell us about their jobs.
- Following an afternoon snack, campers and counselors bring the day to a close with informal activities, called Recreational (Rec) Maneuvers, challenging each other with Battleship, Connect Four, cards, Uno, lanyards and beading, Candy Land, Legos and more.
